KEY FEATURES OF YOUR NEW REFRIGERATOR

Your Samsung French Door Refrigerator comes equipped with various innovative storage and energy-efficient features.

- **Twin Cooling System**

The fridge and freezer have separate evaporators. Due to this independent cooling system, the fridge and freezer cool more efficiently. Additionally, this separate air flow system prevents food odor in one compartment from seeping into the other compartment.

- **Cool Select Pantry^{PLUS}**

The Cool Select pantry^{PLUS} is a full-width drawer with adjustable temperature control.

- **Bigger & Wider Space**

The wide shelf area and pantry provide enough space for larger items like a pizza box, etc. The wide freezer drawer also provides enough space for 2~3 turkeys.

- **Secure Auto Close**

The Secure Auto Close feature automatically closes a door that is slightly open.

- **Compact Ice Maker**

The ice maker can dispense cubed ice.

- **Digital Display and Temperature Control**

- **Slim Water Filtration System**

A slim water filter is placed between the crispers so you can change the filter conveniently without removing items from refrigerator.

- **Door Alarm**

A helpful beeper alerts you if a door is ajar.

- **Tilting Pocket**

The Tilting pocket can be used to store up to a 16" pizza.

- **Auto Pull Out Drawer**

The upper drawer in the freezer comes out automatically as you open the freezer door.

- **Super Extended Drawer**

A large slide-out drawer for easy freezer organization.

- **EZ-Open Handle System**

Lets you open the freezer door with less effort.

This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory, or mental capabilities, or those who lack experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.

SEVERE WARNING SIGNS FOR INSTALLATION

-  Do not install the refrigerator in a damp place or place where it may come in contact with water.
 - Deteriorated insulation of electrical parts may cause an electric shock or fire.
- Do not place this refrigerator in direct sunlight or expose to the heat from stoves, room heaters or other appliance.
- Do not plug several appliances into the same multiple power strip. The refrigerator should always be plugged into its own individual electrical outlet which has a voltage rating that matches the voltage listed on the refrigerator's rating plate.
 - This provides the best performance and also prevents overloading house wiring circuits, which could cause a fire hazard from overheated wires.



Safety Information

- If the wall socket is loose, do not insert the power plug.
 - There is a risk of electric shock or fire.
- Do not use a cord that shows cracks or abrasion damage along its length or at either end.
- Do not bend the power cord excessively or place heavy articles on it.
- Never unplug your refrigerator by pulling on the power cord. Always grip plug firmly and pull straight out from the outlet.
 - Damage to the cord may cause a short-circuit, fire and/or electric shock.
- Do not use aerosols near the refrigerator.
 - Aerosols used near the refrigerator may cause an explosion or fire.



- This refrigerator must be properly installed and located in accordance with the manual before it is used.
- Connect the power plug in proper position with the cord hanging down.
 - If you connect the power plug upside down, the wire can get cut off and cause a fire or electric shock.
- When moving the refrigerator, be careful not to roll over or damage the power cord.
 - This constitutes a fire hazard.
- Make sure that the power plug is not squashed or damaged by the back of the refrigerator.
- Keep the packing materials out of reach of children.
 - There is a risk of death from suffocation if a child puts the packing materials on his or her head.
- The appliance must be positioned so that the plug is accessible after installation.
- You need to remove all the protective plastic film before you initially plug the product in.



- The refrigerator must be safely grounded
 - Always make sure that you have grounded the refrigerator before attempting to investigate or repair any part of the appliance. Power leakages can cause severe electric shock.
- Never use gas pipes, telephone lines or other potential lightning attractors as an electrical ground.
 - Improper use of the grounding plug can result in a risk of electric shock.
 - If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord that has a 3-blade grounding plug and a 3-slot receptacle that will accept the plug on the appliance. The marked rating of the extension cord should be AC115-120 V, 10 A, or more. If a grounding adapter is used, make sure the receptacle box is fully grounded.



- If the power cord is damaged, have it replaced immediately by the manufacturer or its service agent.



CAUTION SIGNS FOR INSTALLATION



- Allow sufficient space to install the refrigerator on a flat surface.
 - If your refrigerator is not level, the internal cooling system may not work correctly.
- Keep the ventilation in the appliance enclosure or mounting structure clear of obstruction.
- Allow the appliance to stand for 2 hours after installation.



SEVERE WARNING SIGNS FOR USING



- Do not insert the power plug with wet hands.
- Do not store articles on the top of the appliance.
 - When you open or close the door, the articles may fall and cause personal injury and/or material damage.
- Do not put a container filled with water on the refrigerator.
 - If spilled, there is a risk of fire or electric shock.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Do not let children hang on the door. A serious injury may occur.
- Do not let children enter inside of the refrigerator. There is a risk of children entrapment.



SEVERE WARNING SIGNS FOR USING

-  • Do not insert your hands into the bottom area under the appliance.
 - Any sharp edges may cause personal injury.
 - Do not let children step on a drawer's cover.
 - The drawer may break and cause them to slip.
 - Do not overfill the refrigerator with food.
 - When you open the door, an item may fall out and cause personal injury or material damage.
 - Do not touch the inside walls of the freezer or products stored in the freezer with wet hands.

 - Never put fingers or other objects into the water dispenser hole, ice chute, or ice maker bucket.

-  • If there are burning smells or smoke, pull out power plug immediately and contact your Samsung Electronics service center.
- If you experience difficulty when changing the light, contact a service agent.
- If the product is equipped with LED Lamps, do not disassemble the Lamp Cover and LED Lamp by yourself.
 - Please contact your service agents.
- If any dust or water is in refrigerator, pull out the power plug and contact your Samsung Electronics service center.
 - Otherwise there is a risk of fire



CAUTION SIGNS FOR USING

-  • Do not re-freeze frozen foods that have thawed completely.
Do not place carbonated or fizzy drinks in the freezer compartment. Do not put bottles or glass containers in the freezer.
 - When the contents freeze, the glass may break and cause personal injury.



Safety Information

- ★ • **Service warranty and Modification.**
 - Any changes or modifications performed by a 3rd party on this finished appliance are not covered under Samsung warranty service, nor can Samsung be responsible for safety issues that result from 3rd party modifications.
 - **Do not block air holes.**
 - If the air holes are blocked, especially with a plastic bag, the refrigerator can be over cooled. If this cooling period lasts too long, the water filter may break and cause water leakage.
 - **If the refrigerator is disconnected from the power supply, you should wait for at least five minutes before plugging it back.**
 - **If you have a long vacation planned or the refrigerator is not to be used for a long period of time, you must empty the refrigerator and pull out the power plug.**
 - Letting the refrigerator run for a long time without using it can cause the insulation to deteriorate and may cause a fire.
 - Wipe excess moisture from the inside and leave the doors open.
 - Otherwise, odor and mold may develop.
 - **To get the best performance from the product:**
 - Do not place foods too close to the vents at the rear of the appliance as it can obstruct free air circulation in the refrigerator compartment.
 - Wrap food up properly or place it in airtight containers before putting it into the refrigerator.
 - **Fill the water tank, ice tray, and water cubes only with potable water.**

- ✍ • **If the product is flooded, make sure to contact your nearest service center.**
 - There is a risk of electric shock or fire.



CAUTION SIGNS FOR CLEANING

- ✍ • **Do not directly spray water on the inside or outside the refrigerator.**
 - There is a risk of fire or electric shock.
- ★ • **Remove any foreign matter or dust from the power plug pins. Do not use a wet or damp cloth when cleaning the plug.**
 - Otherwise, there is a risk of fire or electric shock.


Setting up your French Door Refrigerator

GETTING READY TO INSTALL THE REFRIGERATOR

Congratulations on your purchase of the Samsung French Door Refrigerator. We hope you enjoy the state-of-art features and efficiencies that this new appliance offers.

Selecting the best location for the refrigerator

- A location with easy access to the water supply.
- A location without direct exposure to sunlight.
- A location with a leveled floor.
- A location with enough space for the refrigerator doors to open easily.
- Allow sufficient space to the right, left, back and top for air circulation. If the Refrigerator does not have enough space, the internal cooling system may not work properly.
- Please ensure that appliance can be moved freely in the event of maintenance & service.




If your refrigerator has an ice maker, allow extra space at the back for the water line connections. When you install the refrigerator next to a fixed wall, you need a minimum clearance is 3 3/4" (95mm) between the refrigerator and wall to allow the door to swing open.

First thing! Make sure that you can easily move your refrigerator to its final location by measuring doorways (both width and height), thresholds, ceilings, stairways, etc.


The following chart details the exact height and depth of this Samsung French Door Refrigerator.


- Allow clearance to the right, left, back and top when installing. This will help reduce power consumption and keep your energy bills lower.
- Do not install the refrigerator where the temperature will go below 50°F (10°C).
- Do not locate the refrigerator where it may become wet.

CAUTION When moving your refrigerator To prevent floor damage, be sure the front adjusting legs are in the up position (above the floor). Refer to "Adjusting the level" in the manual (on page15).



FLOORING

For proper installation, this refrigerator must be placed on a leveled surface of hard material that is the same height as the rest of the flooring. This surface should be strong enough to support a fully loaded refrigerator, or approximately 328lbs (150kg). To protect the finish of the flooring, cut a large section of the cardboard carton and place it under the refrigerator where you are working. When moving a refrigerator, you need to pull and push it straight forwards or back. Do not wiggle it from side to side.

REMOVING THE REFRIGERATOR DOORS

Some installations require door removal to transport the refrigerator to its final location.

Do not remove the door/drawer if you don't need to. If you do not need to remove the refrigerator doors, go to adjusting the level. If you need to remove the doors, continue below. Before removing the door/drawer make sure you read following items:

 **WARNING** Disconnect power to the refrigerator before removing the door or drawer.


-  • Be careful not to drop, damage or scratch the door/drawer while removing them.
- Be careful not to get injured while removing the door/drawer.
- Reattach the door/drawer properly to avoid:
 - Moisture from air leakage.
 - Uneven door alignment.
 - Wasting energy due to improper door seal.

Disassemble the refrigerator doors

 **WARNING** Be careful not to drop and scratch the doors while removing the doors.


Disassemble the refrigerator doors

1. With the door opened, remove the cap top table (1) with a flat-blade screwdriver(-), and close the door. Remove the 3 screws holding down the top table (2) and turn it over with several wires connected.




2. Disconnect two connectors (3) on the both side doors, and one connector (4) on the left side door.




3. Remove the 3 hex head bolts (5) attached to the upper left and right door hinges with a socket wrench (10mm). Remove the ground screw (6) attached to the upper left and right door hinges with a philips screwdriver (+). Remove the upper left and right door hinges (7).



4. Lift the door straight up to remove.




5. Remove the screw (8) attached to the lower left and right door hinges with a philips screwdriver (+). Remove the 2 hex head bolts (9) attached to the lower left and right door hinges with an allen wrench (3/16"). Remove the lower left and right door hinges (10).




DISASSEMBLE THE FREEZER DRAWER

1. Take out the upper drawer by lifting it up.




2. Slightly pull the left support guard (2) to the left, allowing the pizza pocket (1) just enough room to slip off the hook. Then pull the pizza pocket (1) forward.




3. Lift up the bottom of the support guard (2) and pull it inward to remove it.

 Do it again, for right side.


 Be careful not to break the parts.


4. Take out the lower basket (3) by lifting the basket up from the rail system.



5. Remove 4 hex head bolts from both sides with a socket wrench (10mm).



6. Lift up the freezer door from the rails.



REATTACHING THE REFRIGERATOR DOORS


Assemble the refrigerator doors

1. Reattach the lower left and right door hinges (**1**). With a Philips head screwdriver, insert the screw (**2**) into the lower left and right door hinges, and then tighten. Insert the 2 hex head bolts (**3**) into the lower left and right door hinges, and then tighten with an allen wrench (3/16”).




2. Place the hole in the bottom of the door over the door hinge (**1**).

 Be careful not to miss the hinge cap because it can be easily taken off.




3. Insert the upper hinges (**4**) into the holes at the top of the doors. Insert the 3 hex head bolts (**5**) into the upper left and right door hinges, and then tighten with a socket wrench (10mm). Insert the ground screw (**6**) into the upper left and right door hinges, and then tighten with a philips screwdriver (+).




REATTACHING THE REFRIGERATOR DOORS

4. Connect the connector (7) on the left side door and two connectors (8) on the both side of doors.



5. Position the top table (9) in place. Insert the 3 screws into the top table, and tighten with a philips screw driver (+). Open the door, reinsert the cap top table (10) and close the doors.


-  When reattaching the top table, make sure that the wires are not pressed or damaged by the hinge cover.
-  After assembling, close the door and check to see whether the door has gaps between gaskets or is tilted. If they are, please refer to "Adjusting the level" on page 15.





ASSEMBLE THE FREEZER DRAWER


1. Pull out the rails fully on each side of the cabinet.




2. Attach the freezer door front onto the open slots on the sides.




3. Tighten 4 hex head bolts completely with a socket wrench(10mm).




4. Insert the lower basket (1) into the rail system.



5. Hook the ends of the tilting pocket (2) onto the brackets (3) and push down until they are locked into place.



 Remove 2 pieces of tape (4) attached to the side of the drawer bin. Reattach the tape in the same position when moving the refrigerator to prevent scratching the drawer bin.





ADJUSTING THE LEVEL


Make sure the refrigerator is level so that you can make final adjustments. Use a level to test if the refrigerator is level both side to side and back to front. If the refrigerator is not level, it will not be possible to get the doors perfectly even, which may cause moisture condensation and increased energy bills. Below is an example of how to level the refrigerator if the left side of the refrigerator is lower than the right side.

How to adjust the level


1. To disassemble the freezer drawer, see 'Step 1' to 'Step 4' on page 11
2. Remove the two screws (1) attached to the cover leg front (2) with a Philips screwdriver(+).



3. Remove the cover leg front (2) by lifting the bottom part of the cover leg front up and pulling it out.



4. Insert a flat-blade screwdriver (-) into a notch on the left control lever, and turn it count clockwise to level the refrigerator. (You turn the lever clockwise to lower the refrigerator and counterclockwise to raise it.)




CAUTION Both control levers must be touching the floor to avoid possible personal injury or property damage because of tipping.

- ☑ If the right side is lower, perform the same procedure, but with the right control lever.
- ☑ It is difficult to remove the cover leg front from the refrigerator, so we do not recommend making small adjustments with the control lever. Instead, refer to the next page for the best way to make minor adjustments to the doors.


MAKING MINOR ADJUSTMENTS BETWEEN DOORS

Remember, a leveled refrigerator is necessary for getting the doors perfectly even. If you need help, review the previous section on leveling the refrigerator.




The left door is fixed. To make minor adjustments between doors, adjust only the right door.

1. Pull out the freezer drawer (1) to expose the lower hinge (2).
2. Insert the supplied allen wrench (3/16") (3) into the shaft (4) of the lower hinge.
3. Please adjust the height by turning the hex wrench (3) clockwise (↻) or counter-clockwise (↺).



When you turn the hex wrench counter-clockwise(↺), the door will move up.


4. After adjusting the doors, please insert the supplied fastener (6) using a pliers (5) in the gap between the hinge-grommet (7) and the lower hinge (8). The number of fastener you'll need to insert depends on the gap.




2 fastener are enclosed with the refrigerator. The thickness of each fastener is 0.04".


ADJUSTING THE FREEZER DRAWER LEVEL





1. Locate the height-adjuster (1) in the freezer drawer.
Unscrew the 8 Phillips screws (2) slightly to loosen the door.



2. Loosen the controller screw (3) with a Phillips screwdriver (+).



3. Find the best level to align the door slope.



→ After adjustment, tighten the controller screw (3) and then the philips screws.

INSTALLING A WATER LINE KIT

To help promote better health, the water filter removes unwanted particles from your water. However, it does not sterilize or destroy microorganisms. You may need to purchase a water purifying system to do that.


For the ice maker to operate properly, a water pressure of 20~125 psi is required. Within this water pressure range, a 170 cc (5.75 oz.) cup fills in about 10 seconds.

If the refrigerator is installed in an area with low water pressure (below 20psi), you can install a booster pump to compensate for the low pressure.


 Water line installation kits are available at extra cost from your dealer. We recommend using a water line installation kit that contains copper tubing and 1/4" compression nut.

Connecting to the water supply line


1. First, shut off the main water supply.



2. Locate the nearest cold water drinking line and install the pipe clamp and shut off valve.



3. Connect the water line installation kit to shut off valve. Check for leaks, then go to Connecting the Water Supply Line to the Refrigerator on the next page.





CONNECTING THE WATER SUPPLY LINE TO THE REFRIGERATOR

Connecting the water supply line to the refrigerator.

There are several items that you need to purchase to complete this connection.

You may find these items sold as a kit at your local hardware store.



1. Slip the compression nut [Ⓐ] through the supplied plastic tubing [Ⓐ].
2. Tighten the compression nut [Ⓐ] onto the 1/4" compression fitting.
 - If you are using copper tubing, slip the compression nut [Ⓑ] (not supplied) and ferrule (not supplied) on copper tubing (not supplied) as shown.
 - If you are using plastic tubing [Ⓑ], insert the molded end (Bulb) of the plastic tubing [Ⓑ] into the compression fitting.



Do not use without the molded end (Bulb) of the plastic tubing [Ⓑ].

3. Tighten the compression nut [Ⓑ] onto the compression fitting. Do not over-tighten the compression nut [Ⓑ].
4. Turn the water on and check for any leakage. If you see water drops or leakage in the connection areas, turn off the main water supply. Check the connections, and tighten more if necessary.
5. Let the ice maker make ice for 1 to 2 days. Over that period of time, throw out the first 1 or 2 buckets of ice the ice maker makes to ensure all impurities have been removed from the water line.
6. Check again for leaks. If you see water drops or leakage in the connection area, turn off the main water supply. Check the connections, and tighten more if necessary.



Only connect the water line to a drinkable water source.

If you have to repair or disassemble the water line, cut off 1/4" of the plastic tubing to make sure you get a snug, leak-free connection.


COMPLETING THE SET UP

Now that you have your new refrigerator installed in place, you are ready to set up and enjoy the features and functions of the appliance. By completing the following steps, your refrigerator should be fully operational.

1. Make sure your refrigerator is in an appropriate location with reasonable clearance between it and the wall. Refer to installation instructions in this manual.
2. Once the refrigerator is plugged in, make sure the interior light comes on when you open the doors.
3. Set the Temperature control to the coldest temperature and wait for an hour. The freezer will get slightly chilled and the motor will run smoothly.
Reset the refrigerator and freezer to the temperatures you want.
4. After you plug the refrigerator in, it will take a few hours to reach the appropriate temperature. You can store food and drinks in the refrigerator after the temperature is sufficiently cool.



Ice off Button

Press the Ice Off button (1) if you don't want to make more ice. The icon (☐^{ICE OFF}) lights up and the Ice-Maker stops making ice.




-  If the following occurs, turn off the ice maker.
- There is enough ice in the ice bucket.
 - You want to save on water and energy.
 - Water is not being supplied to refrigerator.

 **CAUTION** If the ice maker function is ON, and the water line is not connected, you will hear a water valve noise from the back of the unit. Press the Ice Off button until the ice Off indicator (☐^{ICE OFF}) illuminates.

If you want to fill the ice cube bucket to maximum capacity after installation, follow these steps:

1. After the refrigerator turns on for the first time, check the display to see whether the Ice Off light is ON or OFF. If the Ice Off light is ON, press the Ice Off button.
2. Allow your refrigerator to operate and cool down for 24 hours (or 1 full day). Waiting 24 hours will allow your ice maker to cool properly.
3. After 24 hours or one full day, press the Ice Off button again.

-  **CAUTION**
- If ice doesn't come out, press the test button located on the right side of ice maker.
 - Do not press the test button continuously when the tray is filled with ice or water. Water may overflow or the ice may become jammed.
 - Use only the ice maker provided with the refrigerator.
 - The water supply to this refrigerator must be installed/ connected by a suitably qualified person and connected to a potable water supply only.
 - To operate the ice maker properly, water pressure of 20~125psi is required.
 - Do not try to disassemble the ice maker.



Power Freeze Button


Press the Power Freeze button (2) if you want products to freeze more quickly in the freezer. The icon (❄️) lights up and the inside temperature of the freezer decreases for about two and a half hours. To turn off Power Freeze before the 2 1/2 hours are up, just press the button again to cancel the Power Freeze mode.



❏ If you select the Power Freeze mode, you may hear a little of noise because of the continuous operation of the compressor.

Power Cool Button


Press the Power Cool button (5) if you want products to cool more quickly in the fridge. The icon (❄️) lights up and the inside temperature of the fridge decreases for about two and a half hours. To turn off Power Cool before the 2 1/2 hours are up, just press the button again to cancel the Power Cool mode.



❏ If you select the Power Cool mode, you may hear a little of noise because of the continuous operation of compressor.

Freezer Button

Press the Freezer button (3) repeatedly until the desired temperature is shown in the display (A). Whenever you press the button, the temperature will move 1°C degrees with each push. You can set the temperature between -14°C and -22°C. Five seconds after the new temperature is set, the display will again show the actual current freezer temperature until a new temperature is selected.



Fridge Button


Press the Fridge button (4) repeatedly until the desired temperature is shown in the display (B). Whenever you press the button, the temperature will move 1°C degrees with each push. You can set the temperature between 7°C and 1°C. Five seconds after the new temperature is set, the display will again show the actual current refrigerator temperature until a new temperature is selected.




- 3°C is recommended.
- The temperature of the freezer and fridge may rise if you open the doors too frequently or if you place a large amount of warm or hot food inside. This may cause the digital display to blink. Once the freezer and refrigerator temperature return to their normal set temperatures, the blinking stops. If the blinking continues, you may need to “reset” the refrigerator. Try unplugging the appliance, waiting for around 10 minutes, and then plugging the power cord back in.

E.Saver Button

Press the E.Saver Button (6) for better energy efficiency. If E. Saver mode is ON, the button will light up blue.



- If condensation occurs on the doors, wipe up the water drops and turn the E.Saving function off.




The Filter light () lets you know when it is time to change your water filter cartridge. When the filter indicator lights up red, it is time to change the filter. Changing the filter on time provides you with the freshest, cleanest water from your refrigerator. Typically, you need to change the filter about every 6 months.




-  • The Filter Indicator will be Blue when you purchase the new refrigerator.
 - The Filter Indicator will be Pink after the filter has filtered 270 gallons of water or 5 months.
 - The Filter Indicator will be Red after the filter has filtered 300 gallons of water or 6 months.
-  Depending on the condition of your water and region, the amount of time a filter lasts can vary. In some areas, you may need to change the filter every two months.




1. Turn the water filter () about 1/4 turn, counter-clockwise.
2. Pull the water filter () from the case filter ().



-  - To change the water filter more easily, shut off the water supply valve.
- Sometimes, it is hard to disassemble the water filter because impurities in the water can cause it to stick. If this occurs, grip the water filter firmly and pull it hard.
- When you pull the water filter, a little of water can leak from the filter or opening. This is normal. To minimize water leaks, keep the filter cartridge horizontal when you pull it.
- To prevent overflow, empty the water filter tray and dry around the case filter ().




3. Insert the new filter into the case filter ().
4. Push the filter, and then turn it clockwise until it locks.







Moisture may appear at times on the Vertical Hinged Section.
The door handle may become loose over time. If this happens, tighten the bolts found on the inside of the door.
If you close one door with a lot of force, the other door may open.
-  When the door opens, the interlock switch automatically turns off the auger motor in the ice maker for safety reasons.
-  When the interior or exterior LED lamp has gone out, please contact your service agents.

STORING FOOD IN THE FRIDGE

Your Samsung French Door Refrigerator has been designed to provide you with maximum space saving features and functions. Here are some of the customized compartments we have created to keep your food fresher longer. In order to further prevent odor from seeping into the ice compartment, wrap stored food securely and make food containers as airtight as possible.

(1) DAIRY COMPARTMENT	Use to store small dairy items like butter or margarine, yogurt or cream cheese bricks.	
(2) DOOR BINS	Designed to handle large, bulky items such as gallons of milk or other large bottles and containers.	
(3) TEMPERED GLASS SHELVES	Designed to be crack-resistant, the shelves can be used to store all types of food and drinks. Circular marks on the glass surface are a normal phenomenon and can usually be wiped clean with a damp cloth.	
(4) VEGETABLE & FRUIT DRAWERS	Use to preserve the freshness of your stored vegetables and fruits. These drawers can control the level of humidity for items that must retain moisture. Keep vegetables and fruit separate when possible.	
(5) COOL SELECT PANTRY PLUS	Use for large party trays, deli items, pizzas, beverages or miscellaneous items.	

 Do not place any large articles of food under the lamp in the fridge. An air sensor is located near the lamp and if the sensor is blocked, your fridge may become too cold. Please place vegetables and fruit in the vegetable and fruit drawers to avoid freezing them. If the food in your fridge becomes frozen, please set the temperature higher.

STORING FOOD IN THE FREEZER DRAWER

(6) AUTO PULL OUT & SUPER EXTENDED DRAWER	Best used to store meats or dry foods. Stored food should be placed in a container or wrapped securely using foil or other suitable wrapping materials.	
(7) TILTING POCKET	Use for small packages of frozen food. You can store a 16" pizza.


 Bottles should be stored tightly together so that they do not tip and fall out when the fridge door is opened.

 If you plan to go away for a long time, empty the fridge and turn it off. Wipe the excess moisture from the inside of the appliance and leave the doors open.

USING THE COOL SELECT PANTRY^{PLUS}

The Cool Select Pantry^{PLUS} is a full-width drawer with an adjustable temperature control. You can use the Pantry for large party trays, deli items, pizzas, beverages, or miscellaneous items. There is a temperature sensor which can adjust the amount of cold air allowed into the Pantry. The control buttons are located on the right side of the Pantry.




- Press the Temp button repeatedly until the mode you want is lit. Each time you press the Temp button, you select a different mode in this order : Fresh mode (3°C), Chilled mode (1°C), Deli mode (5°C). Initially, the Fresh mode is set. The refrigerator will adjust the temperature in the Pantry to the temperature you selected automatically.
- The Pantry temperature may change depending on the number of items inside and where they are located, the ambient temperature, and how often the door is opened.

Temperature

The Pantry provides three temperature settings: Fresh (3°C), Chilled (1°C), and Deli (5°C).

Selection Button

1. When “Deli” is selected, the temperature of the pantry will be kept around 41°F (5°C). This feature helps keep food fresh for a long time.
2. When “Fresh” is selected, the temperature of the pantry will be kept around 38°F (3°C). This feature helps keep food fresh for a longer time.

1. Door Bins & Dairy Compartment


To remove - Simply lift the bin up and pull straight out.

To relocate - Slide it in above the desired location and push down until it stops.

 **CAUTION** Injury may occur if the door bins are not firmly assembled. Do not allow children to play with bins. Sharp corners of the bins may cause injury.

 Do not adjust a bin full of foods. Remove the food first.

Dust removal method - Remove the guard and wash in water.




2. Tempered Glass shelves

To remove - Tilt up the front of the shelf in the direction shown (1) and lift it up vertically (2). Pull the shelf out.

To relocate - Tilt the front of the shelf up and guide the shelf hooks into the slots at a desired height. Then lower the front of the shelf so that the hooks can drop into the slots.

 **CAUTION** The Tempered Glass shelves are heavy. Use special care when removing them.

 **CAUTION** To prevent the shelves from falling after relocating them, make sure the shelf hooks are placed in the slots properly.




3. Vegetable & Fruit Drawers

To remove - Pull the drawer out to full extension. Tilt up the front of the drawer and pull straight out.

To relocate - Insert the drawer into the frame rails and push back into place.

 **CAUTION** The drawers need to be removed before the glass shelf above them can be lifted out. Do not open the drawers while the Pantry is open. This can scratch or break the drawer.







To remove the divider - Pull the Pantry completely out to full extension and raise the front side of the divider to unhook it from the rear wall of the Pantry, then lift the divider out.





1. Tilting Pocket

To replace - Hook the ends of the tilting pocket (1) onto the support guards (2) and push down until they are locked into place.



2. Ice Bucket


To remove - Open the drawer to full extension. Then remove the ice bucket (1) by lifting it up. (See the illustration below.)

To relocate - Place the ice bucket into the drawer (2).

3. Super Extended Drawer

To remove - Pull the drawer out to full extension. Tilt up the rear of the drawer and lift straight out.

To relocate - Place the drawer onto the rails (4) by tilting it up. Lower the drawer into place until it is horizontal and slide the drawer (3) in.



3. Freezer Drawer

- Pull the freezer drawer out fully. Tilt up the rear of the bin and lift it out to remove.


- Place the bin into the rail assembly.

To remove the divider

- Hook the top corners of divider (1) over a hole in the bin (2).



CLEANING THE REFRIGERATOR

Caring for your Samsung French Door Refrigerator prolongs the life of your appliance and helps keep the refrigerator from odor and germ.

Cleaning the Interior

Clean the inside walls and accessories with a mild detergent and then wipe dry with a soft cloth. You can remove the drawers and shelves for a more thorough cleaning. Just make sure to dry drawers and shelves before putting them back into place.



Cleaning the Exterior

Wipe the control panel and digital display with a damp, clean, soft cloth. Do not spray water directly on the surface of the refrigerator. The doors, handles and cabinet surfaces should be cleaned with a mild detergent and then wiped dry with a soft cloth. To keep your appliance looking its best, polish the exterior once or twice a year.




CAUTION Do not use benzene, thinner, or bleach for cleaning. They may damage the surface of the appliance and may cause a fire.

CAUTION Printed letters on the display may be erased if the stainless cleaner is applied directly to the area where the letters are printed.



Cleaning the Rubber door seals

If the rubber door seals are dirty, the doors may not close properly, and the refrigerator will not operate efficiently. Keep the door seals free of dust or stain by cleaning the doors with a mild detergent and damp cloth. Wipe dry with a clean, soft cloth.




CAUTION Do not clean the refrigerator with benzene, thinner, or car detergent due to risk of fire.

Cleaning the rear side of the refrigerator

To keep cords and exposed parts free of dust and dirt accumulation, vacuum the rear side of the appliance once or twice a year.

CAUTION Do not remove the back cover(1). It may cause an electric shock.

You hear unusual noise or sounds.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check that the refrigerator is level and stable. • Is the back of the refrigerator too close to the wall, preventing proper ventilation? Try moving the back of the refrigerator at least 2 inches from the wall. • Was anything dropped behind or under the refrigerator? • A “ticking” sound is heard from inside the refrigerator. This is normal and occurs because various accessories are contracting or expanding as the result of changes in the temperature of the refrigerator’s interior. • If it sounds as if something is hitting something else inside the refrigerator, this is normal. The sound is caused by ice cubes rubbing in the bucket periodically.
