

CONTROLS OF THE ICE MAKER

The ice maker should be placed where the ambient temperature is between 10-32°C (50-90° F.) If the ambient temperature is above or below this range, the performance of the unit may be affected.

Check the water supply

- 1. Turn off water supply.
- **2.** Disconnect water supply line from the ice maker.
- **3.** Position water supply line in a bucket.
- **4.** Turn on water and make sure water pours into the bucket.
- **5.** Turn water supply off again, then reconnect the water supply line to the ice maker.
- * If unsure, please contact your local plumber.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

CHANGING THE SIZE OF ICE

NOTE: Ice cube sizes differ by density and not volume. A large cube is the same size as a small cube but contains more frozen water.

- 1. Ensure the water supply is connected before changing ice size. The ice maker is automatically set to make medium ice. If you need to change the ice size, you can press the corresponding buttons (see previous page) and the chosen ice size will be indicated by the corresponding indicator light.
- 2. If you want to stop making ice but keep the unit on standby, press the power button for about 3 seconds. All ice indicator lights will turn off and the power indicator light will continue flashing. You are now in standby mode. Do not leave the unit in standby mode in excess of 6 hours. If you want to start making ice again, press the power button one more time.

CONTINUOUS WATER CIRCULATION

This unit operates using a continuous closed cycle of water, with little or no waste. When the unit is on and the water container is low, new water is allowed in from the water source. The water container fills up until the float on the water tank is triggered. The recirculation pump cycles water over the evaporator tray continuously until ice is produced. This process is continuous as long as the unit is left on.

Any water that enters the drain at the bottom of the ice maker cavity is not recycled. It goes into a separate receptacle with a separate drain system that drains out of the back of the unit. This ensures that you're always using clean water.

Note: If the unit is turned off for 24 hours or longer, drain the water from the recirculation system. (see below)

Note: If you are using the continuous drain option (see separate installation instructions) the unit may be turned off during the draining process. If you are using the drain pump option (see separate installation instructions), you must keep the unit turned on.


To drain the water from the system: First turn off the water supply. Remove the ice bucket, and pull the rubber drain tube out from its clips at the front of the internal water reservoir. Slowly lower the rubber drain tube towards the drain port at the back right side of the ice maker cavity. The water will evacuate. (see Fig.H on page 4) When all the water has been drained, replace the tube. Note: If using the continuous drain option (see separate installation instructions) and the unit had been turned off, it may now be turned on again.

ICE BUCKET

Your ice bucket is designed to be easily removed. To remove it, lift up the front part of the box then simply pull it out (see image above.)

⚠ IMPORTANT

This machine is intended to produce ice only. It is not intended for the long-term storage of ice. Move any excess ice into a freezer for long-term storage (>6 hours) if you desire to keep it.




ICE SCOOP

This appliance comes equipped with a stainless steel ice scoop that also facilitates the removal of ice from the ice bucket. Use this scoop to break up any sheets of ice that fall into the bucket.

POWER FAILURE

Most power failures are corrected within a few hours and should not affect the temperature of your appliance if you minimize the number of times the door is opened. If the power is going to be off for a longer period of time, and you are using the drain pump option (see separate installation instructions), you will need to manually drain the water from your unit before next use to avoid an overflow situation. Refer to 'Continuous Drain Installation' for draining instructions on separate installation manual. **Note:** Drain the water from the exterior drain bucket. (take out the botom back panel to get to the bucket. See image below)



Note: When the power is restored the unit will be in standby mode. The customer has to manually restart the unit.

MOVING YOUR ICE MAKER

- Remove all items.
- Securely tape down all loose items (bucket) inside your appliance.
- Turn the adjustable leg up to the base to avoid damage.
- Tape the door shut.
- Be sure the appliance stays secure in the upright position during transportation. Also protect outside of appliance with a blanket, or similar item.
- The ice maker should be relocated to the coolest area of the room, away from heat producing appliances, and out of the direct sunlight.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

CLEANING CYCLE

- **1)** Before starting, turn the unit off and turn off the water supply to unit.
- **2)** When all ice has melted from the evaporator and fallen into the ice bucket, remove the bucket (being careful not to spill any water) and discard or store ice in a separate freezer.

Note: If you are using the continuous drain option, the unit must be turned off during the next step. If you are using the drain pump option (see separate installation instructions), please keep the unit turned on (this allows pump to operate.)


- 3) Remove the rubber drain hose from the left rear of the ice maker cavity. Slowly tilt the drain hose down towards the drain port at the back right lower corner of the ice maker cavity. The water will drain into the drain port. Tilt the drain hose slowly to ensure that the water is not able to overflow the ice bucket area. (see Fig.H)
- **4)** When the water stops coming out of the drain hose, ensure that all water has been drained from water tank area. (Look inside to check that all water has been drained from water container area.) Reinstall the drain hose by pushing it back into the clips.
- **5)** Fill the water tank with a cleaning solution comprised of equal parts water and vinegar. Next, turn the water supply on.
- **6)** Reinstall the ice bucket after the water tank stops refilling, and the unit begins to run again.
- **7)** Allow the unit to produce 4 6 batches of ice, then turn the unit off and allow any remaining ice to fall into the ice bucket.
- **8)** Remove the ice bucket and discard all (6) batches of ice.
- **9)** If the drain pump mode is being used (see separate installation instructions), turn the unit on at this point. Unit has to be in the process (operating mode) in order for the pump to work. If unit is in standby mode pump will not operate. Once again, remove the rubber drain hose from left side clips and slowly drain the cleaning solution into the drain port in bottom right side of cabinet area.
- **10)** When all of the solution has drained and unit begins to cool again, reinstall the ice bucket. Make sure the reservior is full before unit is turned back on.
- **11)** Discard the first 2 batches of ice that fall into the ice bucket.


CLEANING CYCLE

12) Normal ice production can continue when there is no evidence of the cleaning solution remaining in the unit.

OUTSIDE CABINET AND DOOR

- Wash the outside cabinet with warm water and mild liquid detergent. Rinse well and wipe dry with a clean soft cloth.
- Wring excess water out of the sponge or cloth when cleaning any electrical parts.
- 1. Evaporator cover board
- 2. Direction plate
- 3. Water container
- 4. Drain tube
- 5. Clips





CARE AND MAINTENANCE

YEARLY MAINTENANCE FOR AREAS WITH HARD WATER

1) When all ice has been released from the evaporator and fallen into the ice bucket, remove the bucket (being careful not to spill any water) and discard or store ice in a separate freezer.

Note: If you are using the continuous drain option (see separate installation instructions), the unit may be turned off during the next step. If you are using the drain pump option (see separate installation instructions), the unit MUST be turned on. Unit has to be in the process (operating mode) in order for the pump to work. If unit is in standby mode pump will not operate.

Note: Water supply should be turned off, if not it will keep filling up.

2) Remove the rubber drain tube (4) from the water container (3.) Slowly tilt the drain hose down towards the drain port at the back right – lower corner of the ice maker cavity. The water will drain into the drain port. (see Fig.H on page 4)

Note: Tilt the drain tube slowly to ensure that the water does not overflow in the ice bucket area.

- **3)** When the water stops coming out of the drain tube, look inside to check that all water has been drained from water container area. Reinstall the drain tube by pushing it back into the clips.
- **4)** Use a sterile brush to scrape and loosen any hard water buildup from the water container (3,) ice bucket, cover board (1) and direction plate (2.) Then, fill the water container (3) with an approved, non toxic, lime dissolving cleaning solution such as an ice maker cleaner sold in stores, or a solution of equal parts water and vinegar. (see Fig.G on page 4)
- 5) Next, turn the water supply on, turn the unit back on only if using continuous drain option (see separate installation instructions) and had previously turned unit off, and reinstall the ice bucket. The water container will refill, and the unit will begin to run again.
- **6)** Allow the unit to produce 4 6 batches of ice, then turn the unit off and allow time for any remaining ice to fall into the ice bucket.
- **7)** Remove the ice bucket and discard all (6) batches of ice.

Note: If you are using the continuous drain option (see separate installation instructions), the unit may be turned off during the next step. If you are using the drain pump option (see separate installation instructions), the unit MUST be turned on.

Note: Water supply should be turned off, if not it will keep filling up.

8) Once again, remove the rubber drain tube from water container (3) and slowly drain the cleaning solution into the drain port in bottom right side of cabinet area. Water will continue to fill if water is not turned off. (see Fig.H on page 4)

- **9)** When all of the solution has drained, reinstall the ice bucket. Turn the unit back on, only if using continuous drain option (see separate installation instructions) and had previously turned unit off.
- **10)** Discard the first 2 batches of ice that fall into the ice bucket.
- **11)** Normal ice production can continue when there is no evidence of the cleaning solution remaining in the unit.

VACATION TIME

- If the unit will not be used for more than one day, turn the unit off and drain completely (refer to 'Continuous Water Circulation for draining instructions.)
- Winterization: If the unit is only used half the year, the other half it should be kept clean and void of water. Drain the unit as in the 'Continuous Water Circulation' section. Additionally, be sure to remove any water from the drain tank. Utilize the "cleaning cycle" on page 4.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Occasionally, a problem is minor and a service call may not be necessary - use this trouble shooting guide for a possible solution. If the unit continues to operate improperly, call an authorized service depot or Danby's toll free number **1-800-263-2629**.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Occasionally, a problem is minor and a service call may not be necessary - use this trouble shooting guide for a possible solution. If the unit continues to operate improperly, call an authorized service depot or Danby's toll free number **1-800-263-2629**.

- "Water tank is full" troubleshoot using instructions before contacting an authorized service centre.
 - a) Disconnect from power source. Unscrew the drain cap located on the back of the unit and let out the water (refer to installation guide)
 - b) After draining out all the water from the outside water tank, reconnect unit to power and it will continue to run normally.
 - c) If "drain pump mode" (see separate installation instructions) is being used, please confirm the "drain pump switch" is in the "ON" position.
- (2) "Ice maker low on water" troubleshoot using these instructions before contacting an authorized service centre.
 - a) Check if outside water supply is functioning normally. Follow "checking the water supply" instructions (above) and wait 30 minutes for the unit to correct itself.
 - b) If this doesn't work, press the power button to restart the unit.
- (3) "Sensor breakdown" contact our authorized service center for maintenance.
- (4) "System malfunction" System will shut down call an authorized service center.



BEFORE USING ICE MAKER



- Remove the exterior and interior packaging.
- Before connecting the ice maker to the power source, let it stand upright for approximately 2 hours. This will reduce the possibility of a malfunction in the cooling system from handling during transportation.
- Clean the interior surface with lukewarm water using a soft cloth.
- Attach the water inlet and outlet pipe, loosen the screw nut, choose the function switch (see connecting ice maker on page 3.)
- Dispose of the f rst two full batches of ice to clear any dust resulting from transport.

ICE MAKER INSTALLATION

- Place your ice maker on a foor that is strong enough to support it when it is fully loaded. To level your ice maker adjust the front leveling leg at the bottom of the unit. (see leveling instructions below)
- Locate the ice maker away from direct sunlight and sources of heat (stove, heater, radiator, etc.) Direct sunlight and heat sources may increase electrical consumption. Extreme cold ambient temperatures may also cause the unit not to perform properly.
- · Avoid locating the unit in damp areas.
- Plug the unit into an 115/120-volt, 60Hz electrical outlet with three-prong ground receptacle. Do not under any circumstanes cut or remove the third (ground) prong from the power cord. Any questions concerning power and/or grounding should be directed toward a qualif ed electrician or an authorized service center.

LEVELING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) Move the ice maker to its f nal location.
- Have someone gently push against the front of the ice maker to take some weight off of the leveling leg.
- Turn the leveling leg clockwise to raise, and counterclockwise to lower the ice maker. Adjust until level.






TOOLS REQUIRED

FOR YOUR SAFETY:

During installation gloves, safety glasses or goggles should be worn.



- It is recommended that you do not install the unit directly adjacent to a wall. This is to allow the door to have a greater than 90° opening swing. A limited door swing can cause damage to the door gasket and you will not be able to remove the bucket.
- The cabinet opening must be at least 25" deep by 15" wide. The opening should also have a height of at least 35".
- The electrical outlet may be positioned in either side of the adjacent cabinetry, or the rear of the shaded area shown below. Plug in the unit before pushing it into position within the cabinet.
- If the electrical outlet is located inside the adjacent cabinetry, cut a 1-1/2" diameter hole to allow the power cord to pass through it. If the cabinet wall is metal, the hole edge must be covered with a bushing or grommet.



CONNECTING ICE MAKER TO WATER SUPPLY

WARNING

To avoid electrical shock, which can cause death or severe personal injury, disconnect the ice maker from power outlet before connecting a water supply line to the ice maker.

CAUTION

Plastic tubing is not recommended since it greatly increases the potential for water leaks. The manufacturer will not be responsible for any damage if plastic tubing is used for the supply line.

DO NOT install water supply tubing in areas where temperatures fall below freezing.

Connect the ice maker to a potable water source that is not tied into a water softening system. Chemicals from the softener may damage the ice maker, causing it to malfunction.

IMPORTANT

Ensure that your water supply line connections comply with all local plumbing codes.

Before installing the water supply line, you will need:

- 1. Basic tools: an adjustable wrench and a standard flat blade screwdriver.
- 2. Access to a household cold water line with water pressure between 20 and 120 psi.
- 3. A water supply line made of 1/4 inch (6.4 mm) OD copper tubing. To determine the length of copper tubing needed, you will need to measure the distance from the ice maker inlet valve at the back of the ice maker to your cold water pipe. Then add approximately 3 feet (0.9144 meters) so the ice maker can be moved out of the cabinet for cleaning.
- **4.** A shutoff valve to connect the water supply line to your household water system. (DO NOT use a selfpiercing type shutoff valve.)
- 5. A compression nut and ferrule (sleeve) for connecting the water supply line to the ice maker inlet valve.
- 6. A clamp and a number 8, 1/2" screw to secure water line to the unit.


To Connect Water Supply Line to Ice Maker Inlet

- 1. Disconnect ice maker from electric power supply.
- 2. Place end of house water supply line into sink or bucket. Turn ON water supply and flush supply line until water is clear, turn OFF water supply at shutoff valve. Remove plastic cap from water valve inlet and store in safe place.
- 3. Slide brass compression nut, then ferrule (sleeve,) onto water supply line, as shown in Fig. A.
- 4. Push water supply line into water valve inlet as far as it will go (1/4 inch.) Slide ferrule (sleeve) into water valve inlet and tighten compression nut onto valve. Tighten another half turn with a wrench; DO NOT
- 5. Secure the water supply line by putting it through the clamp and fastening with a screw into the screw hole on the back panel (Fig. A.)
- 6. Coil about 3 feet of the excess water supply line behind the ice maker and arrange coils so they do not vibrate or wear against any other surface.
- 7. Turn ON water supply at shutoff valve and tighten any connections that leak.
- 8. Reconnect ice maker to electric power supply.


It takes approximately 1 hour for the first batch of ice to be made. New plumbing may cause ice to be discolored or have poor flavor. Discard first 2 batches and any other discoloured ice.

Although the unit has been tested and cleaned at the factory, due to long-term transit and storage, the first batch of cubes must be discarded.

- Never turn the water supply tap off when the ice maker is workina!
- Never touch evaporator when unit is running!
- To reduce melting and ensure proper ice formation keep the door closed at all times except when taking ice from the unit.

B - Is a continuous drain option



DOOR REVERSAL DIRECTIONS

This appliance can be modified for the door to open from either the left or the right side. The unit is delivered to you with the door opening from the left side. If you wish to reverse the opening direction, follow the instructions below:



- **1.** Bottom hinge (Right)
- 2. Screws
- 3. Axis plate
- 4. Door
- **5.** Hinge pin (Right)
- 6. Top hinge (Right)
- 7. Screws
- 8. Top hinge (Left)
- 9. Decorative plugs
- **10.** Bottom hinge (left)

- 1. Remove 2 screws (2) from axis plate (3) at bottom of door. Slide the door from bottom hinge, then pulling down off of top pin (Fig. F1/F2.) Pull axis plate (3) out from door, and place both door and axis plate aside.
- 2. Remove 3 screws (7) from the top right hinge, remove hinge(6) and put aside (Fig. F3.)
- **3.** Remove decorative plugs (9) from the top left side of the cavity frame (Fig. F4.) Replace the decorative plugs into the top right side of the cavity frame.
- 4. Line up top left hinge (8) with holes and fasten with 3 screws that were removed from the right side.
- 5. Place (push in, do not screw in) axis plate (3) into the bottom of the door on left side.
- **6**. Push door onto top hinge pin and slide door onto lower hinge, make sure axis plate is between door and lower hinge.
- 7. Install 2 screws (2) in the axis plate through the lower left hinge and into the axis plate, making sure the door is properly aligned to the cabinet.
